

It's Friday!

Italy will take on defending champion Spain in the final of the UEFA Euro 2012. The Italians - lead by a two goal performance by Mario Balotelli - held off Germany by a 2-1 score to advance to the final. Spain earned a spot with a 4-2 shootout win over Portugal.

Davis selected

The New Orleans Hornets did as expected - selecting Kentucky's Anthony Davis with the No. 1 overall pick in the NBA Draft vester day. Davis, a 6-foot-10 power forward, averaged 14.2 points, 10.4 rebounds and had a school-record 186 blocks while leading the Wildcats to the national title.

Ouick extended

The Los Angeles Kings have agreed to terms with goaltender Jonathan Quick on a 10-year contract extension. Quick backstopped the Kings to the NHL club's first Stanley Cup title in franchise history this season - collecting the Conn Smythe Trophy as playoff MVP along the way.

Agreeable contract

The Pittsburgh Penguins have agreed to a long-term contract extension with star forward Sidney Crosby. The 12-year, \$104.4million US deal will keep Crosby with the club through the 2024-25 campaign. Crosby played just 22 regular-season games last season because of concussion-related injuries. He still manage to posted eight goals and 29 assists for 37 points during the regular season, then added three goals and five assists in six playoff games.

Cap increased

The National Hockey League has announced a salary cap increase of \$5.9 million to a total of \$70.2 million for the 2012-13 season. All 30 teams must spend at least \$54.2 million, with an adjusted midpoint of \$62.2 million.

New deal

The Columbus Blue Jackets have re-signed Russian defenceman Nikita Nikitin to a new deal. The 26-year-old blueliner, who was set to become a restricted free agent on July 1st, was acquired by the Jackets from the St. Louis Blues last November. He finished the season with a combined seven goals and 32 points in 61 games.

Briefly detained

Rapper Snoop Dogg was briefly detained at Norway's Kjevik Airport after being found in possession of marijuana and a large sum of cash. Dogg, whose real name is Calvin Broadus, was given a fine - but won't face jail time because he was carrying less than the country's 15-gram maximum. Officials say the rapper cooperated fully with customs officials and paid the fine on-site.

Tiger dies

Thriller, a 13-year-old tiger that belonged to Michael Jackson when the entertainer lived at his Neverland estate, has passed away. The 170-kilogram tiger and brother Sabu lived at the ranch with Jackson until 2006 when the entertainer left for good. The big cats were then taken in by a wildlife preserve located near Los Angeles - while other Neverland animals, including giraffes, flamingos, orangutans, elephants and dozens of reptiles, were sent to other sanctuaries in other parts of the country.

Played nemesis

Character actress Doris Singleton has passed away at the age of 92. Singleton, who guested in a large number of both comedies and dramas during her 30-plus year career in television, is best remembered for her recurring role on I Love Lucy as Lucy's nearsighted neighbour and sometimes nemesis Carolyn Appleby.

Passes away

Veteran actor Don Grady has passed away at the age of 68. Grady played Robbie Douglas on the long-running 1960s hit series My Three Sons - which co-starred Fred MacMurray and William Demarest. He was also one of the Mickey Mouse Club's original Mouseketeers.

ALLOWED TO PROCEED

The Supreme Court of Canada has decided to allow a class-action lawsuit against Canadian cellphone companies over system access fees to proceed. The \$19-billion action, which was launched in 2004 against some of the country's biggest wireless carriers, including Rogers, Telus and Bell Mobility, alleges the cellphone companies wrongfully collected access fees from customers. The lawsuit alleges that the carriers misled Canadian users into thinking the access fee - typically between \$6.95 and \$8.95 a month - was a fee by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission, when in fact it was an just extra revenue stream for the cellphone companies.

Law upheld

The U.S. Supreme Court has upheld U.S. President Barack Obama's controversial healthcare law - which requires uninsured Americans to purchase health insurance under threat of a financial penalty. The document also forces insurers to cover people with pre-existing medical conditions. The law, which seeks to cut skyrocketing health-care costs and extend health insurance to 30 million uninsured Americans, was challenged by officials in 26 states, led by falls far short of the \$230 Florida, who argued the White House overreached in its interpretation of the clause.
